On the Road: Enigma Challenge Launches in NI

84 Year 9 students from **Foyle College** took part in the first-ever Enigma Challenge in Northern Ireland - a mobile CyberFirst experience brought directly into the classroom.

Led by trainer Ciaran, students used tools like CyberChef to crack WWII-style coded messages, combining historical context with real-world cybersecurity techniques.

Next stops: **Strathearn School**, **Rainey Endowed School**, and **Belfast Model School for Girls**. We're excited to keep growing the next generation of cyber talent.

Cyber Explorers Cup

Congratulations to **Our Lady's Grammar School**, Newry, winners of the 2025 Cyber Explorers Cup in Northern Ireland - an interactive competition designed for students aged 11–14 across the UK.

The school will receive £2,000 in tech vouchers and enjoy a special half-day Careers Day, hosted by Cyber Explorers and supported by CyberFirst NI.
